'Kalgoorlie Memories' Headframe

Situated in the library is a handmade headframe constructed by a former KPS student, David Henderson. Mr Henderson started at KPS in 1935 and after completing his primary school years, he attended Eastern Goldfields SHS then later, the Kalgoorlie School of Mines where he completed an an electrical apprenticeship. Mr Henderson worked in the Kalgoorlie before marrying in 1953 and moving to Collie where he still lives today, he will be 96yrs old this month.

The headframe, created during his retirement, is in honour of Mr Henderson's fond memories of Kalgoorlie and he has kindly donated it for KPS students to enjoy.







Positive Behaviour Recognition

This year we have made a change to the way we recognise positive behaviour both in and out of the classroom.

We have designed 'Values Tokens' (similar to the previous 'Faction Tokens') that recognise students displaying positive behaviours that align with our values of Mindfulness, Determination, Inclusion and Respect.

Along with recognising individual students, the intention of this system is also to build faction pride and belonging.

Once a fortnight, the tokens are collected by the Faction Captains and points are tallied for each faction. During this time, 2 tokens from each faction are drawn for individual prize winners, a canteen voucher, and winners are announced over the PA.

The faction with the most tokens at the end of each fortnight will receive a Friday lunch time reward. Rewards include: icy poles, mini movies in Senior Hall and a game of dodge ball with Mr Ferguson as the man in the middle!


