A big thank you to everyone who supported the Mother's Day Stall. It was a great success, raising over \$1200 for the school.

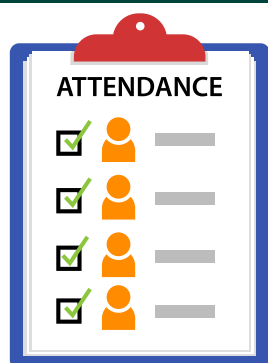
The KPS school community spirit was at its best with lots of volunteers chipping in to help man the stall and we loved watching the children thoughtfully choose gifts for their loved ones.
