Principals Message

The end of term is drawing ever close. I am not sure if you feel the same, but it seems that time is just flying by! It has been a very busy term with some fantastic highlights. I would like to acknowledge the staff, students and community for a great term. It is a privilege to walk through classes and see deep learning occurring across all classes.

Attendance

Our staff have been reviewing attendance data, and although we have trending up since 2022 when COVID hit Kalgoorlie, we feel that we can improve. One aspect of this is 'authorised absences'. An absence becomes 'authorised' when the school is notified of student whereabouts. If your child is away, please either call or email the school, or respond to the text message you receive around lOam. Research shows that increasing the percentage of 'authorised absences' increases overall attendance. The other aspect of attendance that I'd like you to know about is the fact that schools are not in a position to 'make up a day'. This means that if your child is away, they will miss the teaching of that day, with no possibility of going back over it. In my own schooling, my parents took me on a four-week holiday in Year 4. My class did long division. I missed the teaching, and to this day have not learned long division (lucky I taught Year 3!). Remember, every moment counts.

Free-dress Days

We have some dress ups coming in Term 3. They are:

We expect the best of our students at Kalgoorlie Primary School, as we want to deliver the best possible education for our students, to set them up for future success. With this in mind, in the coming terms we will focussing on small routines across the school. This includes expectations around lining up, walking around the school and entering classrooms. If students can meet these expectations on the small things, we believe that they will be better prepared for the big things, like learning in class.

I would like to be a part-time soccer or basketball player and a full-time engineer.




From the Faction Captains

KPS Team Uniforms


Students attending this weeks Winter Lightning Carnival will do so in style, proudly wearing our new shirts, guernseys and netball dresses for representative carnivals.

Created by Mr Rundle together with senior students, our unique teamwear features Indigenous designs symbolic of Kalgoorlie Primary School.










