This approach gives every child the best possible start in literacy and helps us quickly support anyone who needs extra help. We are seeing fantastic progress from our students using this program.

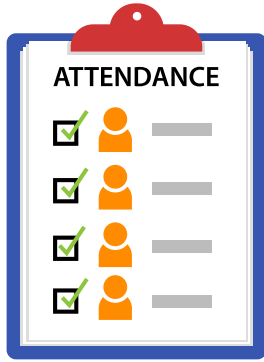
